July 26 as the feast of Ss. Joachim and Anne together dates only from the time of Vatican II. Before that, the feast belonged to Anne alone, who was more popular than her spouse. Veneration of St. Anne dates from the fourth century, while interest in St. Joachim didn't emerge until the 15th century. He didn't even get his own feast day until 1913.

In a time when children were considered a sign of God's favour, Joachim and Anne were mocked for being childless. Instead of becoming bitter, Joachim and Anne each prayed to God for a child; angels appeared to each separately and promised that they would conceive. The church honours Joachim and Anne for their role in God's plan for salvation. Their daughter, Mary, grew in grace and holiness under the loving care of her parents, who dedicated her to God's service from the time of her conception. Joachim and Anne are also honoured for their trust in God and their gratitude for his blessing in giving them a child.

Tradition says that Joachim and Anne both lived to see the birth of their grandchild, Jesus, and died of old age.
